■ Animal Science

What is Animal Science?

Animal Science deals with the dairy and livestock industry, with emphasis in nutrition, physiology, genetics, management technology, quality control, and environmental regulations.

Career Opportunities in Animal Science

Graduates holding this degree find employment in farm management, extension service, food quality control, government health agencies, and farm credit institutions.

Salary Trends

According to a July 2005 survey by the National Association of Colleges and Employers, the average beginning annual salary for graduates with a bachelor's degree in animal science was \$30,614.

How to Major in Animal Science at Tennessee Tech

When applying for admission to the university, students should list Agriculture as their major and Animal Science as their concentration. To schedule a campus visit, go to our website at www.tntech.edu/visit. During your campus visit, you will talk with an advisor of Animal Science.

General Education Curriculum Requirements

Students majoring in Animal Science must meet the School of Agriculture requirements for a bachelor's degree. Every student must complete the statewide General Education requirement, which consists of 41 hours distributed among six categories of coursework--Communications, Humanities, American History, Sciences, Mathematics, and Social Studies. For some students, depending

on their major programs, choices of General Education courses in certain categories may be restricted.
